Isaiah 58:8-10

5. What we give in love for the Justice of others God will provide back all we need even unto overflowing AND restoration will happen as a result of seeking Justice.

Isaiah 58:11-12 2 Promises as we seek Justice

- 1. Will not run dry or be burned out.
- 2. What has been broken down for generations will be built up again.

5.b Restoration will happen as a result of seeking Justice.

Isaiah 61:1-4 – The captives will be set free and they will be the ones empowered to rebuild the ancient ruins.

 Hope does not disregard pain. But this hope of good news it will come to pass because of God. And it is the source of courage we need to face injustice and actually go into the pain.
